JOURNALISM

Journalism classes at Leeward enable students to take a critical look at the ever-expanding world of media and its effect on our society. The courses are essential for students who are interested in journalism as a career, but are also relevant for those students who wish to broaden their understanding of how the media affects all areas of American culture. Students learn about news judgement - what is important and relevant in the news and how to write both interesting and communicative news and feature stories. In addition, students learn to develop a sense of journalistic ethics and how to spot bias in the media.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

The English as a Second Language (ESL) Program offers English classes for all levels of learners—beginning, intermediate and advanced. ESL Program helps students to prepare for a degree at Leeward or to transfer to a four-year college or university. In the ESL Program, students who are primarily resident immigrants are placed in the ESL Program according to their language abilities as determined by the ESL COMPASS test. Students usually take a minimum of two ESL courses each semester. Each three-credit course meets two or three times per week for sixteen weeks.

ESL courses are equivalent to English courses and provide students the opportunity to improve their communication skills.

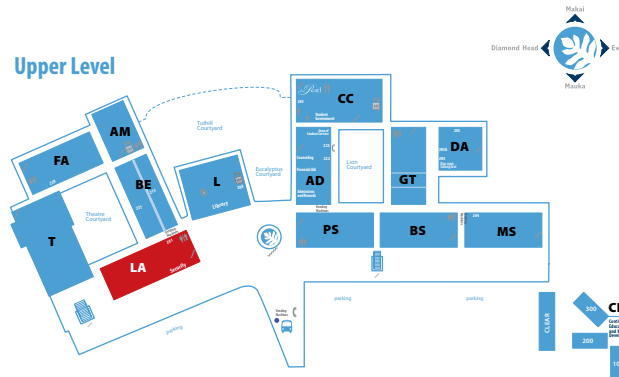

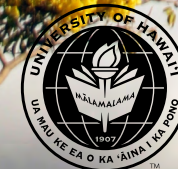
